### School work to do at home in the event of school closure

As per the letter we sent yesterday, **no school closures have been advised as yet** so school is open as normal. Today we are sending home the pack of learning activities for your child to complete at home if school is closed. The suggested timetable we sent yesterday still stands and below is a list of what children should complete **each day**.

## Year 2

### Every day

- 1-2 pages from CGP GPS booklet
- 1-2 pages from CGP targeted maths booklet
- 1 page from CGP Handwriting
- 30 minutes reading (school reading books or, if your child has finished reading those, another book of their choice)
- 15 mins times tables practice (2,5,10 and 3 times tables).
- 4 a day maths (make your own calculations up to practise things that you have already been taught and use the Key Stage One Maths Mental Workout CGP booklet)
- PE - get moving for **at least** half an hour (BBC super movers is excellent, as is Go Noodle)

### Every other day

- Reading comprehension unit from CGP booklet
- Fill in reading journals and make a note of any new vocabulary and their definitions
- Writing for at least 30 minutes – you can write about anything but some suggestions are a diary, a story or a factual report about something that interests you.

### Learning in other subjects – this can be spread out across the week

Science experiments – particularly Plants – as this is our current topic.

Art – using inspiration from animals and nature.

Research on a topic linked to History or Geography.

Our History topic is House and Homes – looking at what has changed within our life time.

Geography would be to explore maps using compass directions and perhaps making their own maps of the local area.

- KS1 BBC Bitesize, which had activities for all subjects.
- The training Space twitter page for activities linked to reading and writing.
- CAFOD Education resources linked to our Sacred Heart Goal of Social Awareness.



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### EXTRA LEARNING

Year 2 SATs practice can include the 10 minutes KS1 SAT Buster Tests and the Reading SATS brown envelopes, which include 4 papers to develop reading comprehension skills.
